1. Welcome & Introductions	
2. Approval of minutes from 10-14-11 meeting	
3a. Discussion Topics/ Presentations	<p>Gary Ander announced that Alamance county received great reviews and shows sustainability with positive outcomes.</p> <p>Joel announced that DPI approved the new sex education programs to be developed and will be integrated with integrity.</p> <p>Gail Cormier began the meeting with a brief overview of finances for NCFU accounts. She clarified that NCFU took over MHA funding of \$3000 as an in-kind favor for the group, even though at that time NCFU paid 10% to their fiscal contractor for book keeping , to support this group. NCFU currently has \$7 left in this account, and is asking for it to clear the books.</p> <p>NCFU has \$18,367 from the Chapel Hill money to support the 2008 conference, after the conference was canceled the state collaborative allocated these funds for family and youth to come do state meetings, and to pay staff for work at the collaborative. There is \$13,766 left in this budget. NCFU also manages this funds without charging indirect, in-kind.</p> <p>There is \$189,000 in the training committee budget, averaging \$22,000/month. The state collaborative does not have deliverables assigned and needs to set this up as soon as possible.</p> <p>NCFU also noted that they volunteered, with assistance from training committee, to support online training. She noted that there were previous problems in which Bank of America VISA was overcharging and NCFU received several complaints regarding the issue. NCFU has answered many complaints and instated a refund to those overcharged. She also noted that she has since switched from Bank of America to Bank of North Carolina, and is very pleased with the ownership they have taken. The care of the online training is more involved and in spring NCFU asked the group to allow her to charge the 10% overhead that NCFU had to pay to their financial contractor to support this part of the budget.</p>

3c. Agenda Items for Future Meetings	<p>Joel pointed out that the training committee that Gail, Joanna, and Hope has put together has done a wonderful job putting together a great product at a great price.</p> <p>Rick and Karen began their presentation on fatherhood engagement in NC. Key points to note are as followed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • North Carolina rose to the top of the 13 states given the grant and is competing with Kansas. • in regards to social marketing, it is important to use effective wording-- "responsible fatherhood" does not result in positive outcomes. • There needs to be development of fatherhood development council using the incredible years curriculum as a model, using local coaches to address issues involving barriers • Currently, fatherhood engagement is represented in all 100 counties. They are building a virtual fatherhood resource center, and asking for any input or ideas to include. • On November 29, they are meeting in Greensboro to develop a strategic plan from 12-2 • Mothers are asked to be at the table as equal partners, Child-Family team models used as a mechanism for a variety of people and domains to use to create cross successes. It is important for agencies to communicate with each

other so there is a consistent language used throughout.

Joel pointed out that fathers engaged at conception (and throughout pregnancy) are more engaged

There is a distinction to include functional fathers in addition to biological fathers.

The presentations ended 20 minutes earlier than expected. The state collaborative returned to finish up budget questions with Gail Cormier. After the budget was fully explained, all thought the next step would be to decide how the Becoming Grant \$5,000 assigned to the collaborative should be used. This discussion will be further discussed at the next collaborative meeting as an agenda item on December 9, 2011.
